A 57TH TOUR FOR THE OSM

THE ORCHESTRE SYMPHONIQUE DE MONTRÉAL TAKES FLIGHT TODAY ON ITS 16TH EUROPEAN TOUR

Montreal, October 18, 2022 — The Orchestre symphonique de Montréal boards a plane today for its first tour in Europe with Music Director Rafael Payare, performing in 5 prestigious European halls. From October 21 through 28, the Orchestra's 97 musicians will be joined by three internationally acclaimed soloists. The OSM's prominent role as cultural ambassador for Montreal, Quebec, and Canada is emphasized by the tour.

This European trip promises to be rich and exciting: the Orchestra will perform four separate programs, joined by pianists Víkingur Ólafsson and Bruce Liu, winner of the 2012 OSM Competition and 2021 International Chopin Piano Competition, as well as by violinist Augustin Hadelich.



Islandic pianist Víkingur Ólafsson will perform for the first time with the Orchestra on tour, appearing at Zagreb's Vatroslav Lisinski Hall, Budapest's Müpa Hall and London's Southbank Centre to perform Ravel's Piano Concerto in G. The programs for these cities also include Shostakovich's Symphony no. 10 and Liszt's Les Préludes (Zagreb and Budapest), as well as *Elysium* by Montreal composer **Samy Moussa** (Vienna and London), who received his first OSM commission at age 19. Significant Fact: **This will be the Orchestra's first visit to Hungary!**







Montreal pianist Bruce Liu will showcase his virtuosity at the Vienna **Konzerthaus**, in a work that he presented last summer in connection with the 2022 Classical Spree: **Rachmaninoff's** *Rhapsody on a Theme of Paganini*. The tour's first concert in Vienna will also feature Shostakovich's Symphony no. 10 and Samy Moussa's Elysium. For its second concert in Vienna, the OSM will collaborate with a Viennese choir, the Wiener Singakademie, to present Brahms' *Nänie*, op. 82, and Song of Destiny. Mahler's *Symphony no. 5* completes that evening's concert. **Vienna was one of the first city visited on tour by the Orchestra in 1962 under Zubin Mehta, today an OSM Conductor Emeritus, and holds special significance for the OSM.**



For its fourth visit to the **Centre for Fine Arts** in Brussels, OSM guest artist, the Italian-German-American violinist Augustin Hadelich will perform **Mozart**'s Concerto no. 5 in A major. **Mahler**'s Symphony no. 5 completes that evening's program in the Belgian capital.
