# A debut album for the OSM and Rafael Payare

**Montreal, February 6, 2023** — The Orchestre symphonique de Montréal and Rafael Payare are proud to launch their recording on the **Pentatone** label of Gustav Mahler's Symphony no. 5 in C-sharp minor. Recorded in August 2022, this album marks the beginning of a multi-year collaboration between Pentatone and the OSM. The Orchestra continues its rich recording tradition, begun in 1980, with what is now its **132**<sup>nd</sup> album. The OSM's extensive discography is available **here**.

A work by a composer close to Maestro Payare's heart, Gustav Mahler's Fifth Symphony is deeply personal, written in the prime of the composer's life. The extremes in the music—from the darkness of the funeral march to the ecstatic joy of the finale—faithfully reflect the highs and lows of his own life at the time of composition: from surviving a near-death experience to marrying his beloved Alma and being appointed Director of the Vienna Court Orchestra.

I could not be happier to be immersed in Mahler's score with the Orchestre symphonique de Montréal. Their technical finesse and their tonal colour, range and depth bring to life the vast musical canvas that the composer created. ### MAHLER AND THE OSM, CONDUCTED BY RAFAEL PAYARE

The OSM and Maestro Payare will travel to the United States to perform this great work at the Kennedy Center in Washington on March 6 and at the Carnegie Hall in New York on March 8, before reuniting with Montreal audiences on March 9 at the Maison symphonique de Montréal. Gustav Mahler's monumental "Resurrection" Symphony no. 2 opened the OSM's 89th season; his Third Symphony under the direction of Rafael Payare will close the 2022–2023 season on May 31 and June 1, 2 and 3. These concerts are part of a Mahler cycle during which the Orchestra will perform this Austrian composer's complete symphonies and main vocal works over the coming seasons.
