The return of its large-scale free concert at the Esplanade of the Olympic Park conducted by Maestro Rafael Payare!

Montreal, July 7, 2021 – With great excitement and joy, the OSM today unveils the details of its summer season. To begin: the series SUMMER IN THE CITY WITH THE OSM is back, with small ensembles of musicians from the Orchestra bringing communities some 40 surprise outdoor performances! Then, a long-standing tradition continues as the OSM performs a total of five concerts at the Festival de Lanaudière. Finally, a much-awaited moment like no other: the OSM presents its large-scale, free, outdoor concert on the Esplanade at Montreal's Olympic Park on September 9 with new Music Director Rafael Payare. All of these activities and concerts are amazing opportunities for families and friends, and for everyone to share wonderful moments!

CONCERT AT THE ESPLANADE OF THE OLYMPIC PARK: SEPTEMBER 9

On Thursday, September 9 at 7:30 p.m., **Rafael Payare** and the full Orchestra perform a large-scale open-air free concert on the Esplanade at Montreal's Olympic Park. This first public event since Maestro Payare's appointment is a fine opportunity to hear him conduct some of the repertoire's most brilliant gems: **Tchaikovsky**'s famous Overture to *Romeo and Juliet*, **Stravinsky**'s majestic *Firebird*, as well as works by **Falla**, **Ginastera** and **Lili Boulanger.**

SUMMER IN THE CITY WITH THE OSM SERIES BEGINS TODAY!



Fourteen Montreal boroughs and five cities of the Greater Montreal Area come alive with **THE 2021 SUMMER**IN THE CITY WITH THE OSM series, with members of the OSM in chamber formation offering passers-by impromptu performances in various parks, nine CHSLDs (long-term care facilities), a few community organizations and two summer day camps! To add to the fun, selected performances will feature *The Living History of Music*, a concert of emerging artists who highlight key moments in the history of music and of the violin. This cultural mediation event is an original OSM production in collaboration with students in musical

mediation at Université de Montréal's Observatoire interdisciplinaire de création et de recherche en musique and author / stage director Martin Gougeon.

To kick off its new summer season today, the OSM chose **Place Sun-Yat-Sen** in **Chinatown** and Montreal's Chinese community which has been especially hard hit by the pandemic. This gesture of cheer and show of solidarity also aligns with the City of Montreal's revitalization plan for the neighbourhood.

All such events will comply with physical distancing requirements. Their precise locations will, nevertheless, remain a surprise – to limit the number of people at gatherings!

HARMONIOUS COLLABORATIONS THIS SUMMER

In July, the FESTIVAL DE LANAUDIÈRE once again welcomes the OSM for five distinct performances including three conducted by Jacques Lacombe and one by Kent Nagano. The OSM's Conductor Emeritus will lead the Festival's OPENING CONCERT on July 16. The following day, on July 17, Maestro Lacombe conducts THE OSM AND BEETHOVEN'S 5TH SYMPHONY; on July 30, this Quebec conductor takes to the podium in PASTORAL CLASSICS and again, in ROMANTICISM IN THE FRENCH STYLE, on July 31. It will be an opportunity to hear soloists Hélène Guilmette (soprano), Mélisande McNabney (harpsichord), and Bryan Cheng (cello). Then, on Sunday, July 18, OSM Chorusmaster Andrew Megill conducts the OSM Chorus in SONGS OF LOVE, an afternoon of choral singing spanning centuries of music.

Another high point of the summer will be **Week-end classique**, in collaboration with **Quartier des Spectacles Partnership** and taking place **from August 12 to 15**. This four-day event is part of *Les aventures du cœur de l'île* and offers the public the opportunity to choose from a whole range of musical performances occurring simultaneously across the downtown area. Finally, beginning July 24 at Saint-Paul Park in the Montreal borough of Le Sud-Ouest, the public can enjoy *La sentinelle*, an interactive participatory installation for the public space produced by HUB STUDIO and LA BOÎTE INTERACTIVE. *La sentinelle* celebrates the unifying and universal nature of music and its compelling introspective and evocative power. Passers-by are taken by surprise and given the opportunity to discover the living arts, in an open-air performance hall and through the symphonic music of the OSM.
