# The Orchestra starts up again with the music of Beethoven and Mozart

Montreal, September 8, 2020 – With brilliance and excitement in equal measure, the Orchestre symphonique de Montréal is soon to kick off its new season, also marking a decade on the stage of the magnificent Maison symphonique, in a fall opening that could hardly be more unusual! Eager to re-engage with audiences, from September 11 to 13, the OSM offers a series of concerts in connection with Beethoven's 250th birthday celebrations. Spanning four programs directed by Quebec conductor **Bernard Labadie**, this major event encompasses symphonies, concertos, chamber music and vocal music, highlighting Beethoven's musical affiliation with another Viennese genius: Mozart! In the course of these four triumphant concerts, the OSM is proud to welcome a roster of all-local artists: sublime soloists **Marie-Nicole Lemieux** (Artist-in-Residence), **Karina Gauvin, James Ehnes, André Moisan,** and **Charles Richard-Hamelin.** 







In keeping with Public Health regulations, only 250 people may be admitted to the Maison symphonique per performance. The OSM will, however, make these four September concerts accessible via webcast. Designed specially for the occasion in collaboration with well-known Quebec artist **Brigitte Poupart**, these concerts will offer an enhanced experience; original staging, redesigned lighting, and exclusive content, all for the benefit of live spectators as well those viewing concerts from their home; interviews with musicologists and historians about works on the programmes; talks with guest soloists and conductors, as well as up-close and personal footage of rehearsals with the artists.



**HEALTH AND SAFETY FIRST** For the OSM, the health and safety of its audiences, musicians and staff is its highest priority. Concerts will be given under the strictest sanitary conditions, in compliance with Public Health directives. A health protocol for the Maison symphonique has been designed in collaboration with the venue's resident staff and administration, the OSM and Place des Arts. Several measures will consequently be implemented, and audience members are invited to consult our website for further details.

For the three subsequent concerts presented from September 15 to 29 on the OSM website, home-based audience members are invited to make a donation in the amount of their choice (providing for a minimum of \$10 per concert). Each concert will be available to view for a period of seven days.
