Unveiling of the Children's Corner series and other initiatives!

Montreal, November 9, 2021 — Since its foundation in 1934, the OSM has placed education at the heart of its mission. The Orchestra's bold, creative initiatives have helped younger generations embrace classical music as a lasting feature of their lives. This year again, November is designated YOUTH MONTH, and all month long, the OSM highlights the varied and wide-ranging educational projects that have energized the institution since its earliest days.

2022 CHILDREN'S CORNER SERIES: TICKETS ON SALE NOW!

The Children's Corner series brings young audiences on a journey of symphonic music discovery with all its magic! This season, two musical encounters are sure to delight the whole family. First, on March 20, 2022, make way for Together No Matter What! featuring the percussionists of the TorQ quartet. In this concert conducted by Adam Johnson and staged by Louis-François Grenier, spectators of all ages will enjoy the ensemble's adventures and close camaraderie as they show that everything is about friendship and playing together. Then, on May 15, 2022, Play Me a Poem beckons families into the fantasy world of fables and poetry. With conductor Thomas Le Duc-Moreau and host Marianne Verville, savour the beauty of words intertwined with symphonic works in a concert combining music, theatre, and poetry with texts and staging by Martin Gougeon.

THE 2021 OSM COMPETITION: SPOTLIGHT ON THE VOICE

After the massive success of its first online edition in 2020, the Competition returns in full force this year with a formula designed for both artists and music lovers. Its web platform enables candidates to be seen and heard from coast to coast! The 2021 OSM Competition winner will be announced on November 27 and will perform in concert with the OSM and **Rafael Payare** on January 16, 2022.

LOTS MORE INITIATIVES!

- First, we should mention that the OSM teamed up with *Culture pour tous* for the activity **Une chanson** à **l'école** as part of the *Journées de la culture*! Students throughout Quebec and French-speaking Canada were introduced to a song written specially for them, performed by **Ariane Moffatt** and the OSM. <u>Here</u> is a recap of the project, which involved more than 1000 schools!
- In addition, the OSM and philanthropist **Michel Phaneuf**, in collaboration with music therapist Nathalie Leroux and St-Étienne School in Montreal, will wrap up the **OSMose** project enabling children with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and students in the regular curriculum to connect with music and art through adapted workshops. The project concludes with two concerts on April 7 and 10 at the Maison symphonique.



- Another OSM initiative, the **Euphonie** project, aims to foster intercultural encounters between elementary school students from the Association of Jewish Day Schools and public schools in Quebec. This fall, students will have the opportunity to develop their knowledge of the symphony orchestra with an online concert and a talk with an OSM musician. This project continues throughout the school year!
- Year after year, School Matinees produce engaging encounters between the OSM and thousands of schoolchildren for whom the opportunity to discover the different facets of the Orchestra is always a source of great enthusiasm. Upcoming School Matinees will be announced on January 11.
- La musique aux enfants is a musical pre-school and kindergarten program in the borough of Montréal-Nord in which over 200 children can develop and benefit from intensive music instruction. In addition, the program reaches out to over 100 families in the community each week, enabling them to discover the world of classical music through a variety of activities.



♣ On November 28, families are invited to attend a free interactive concert at the Maison culturelle et communautaire de Montréal-Nord, featuring some of Mozart's best-known melodies, with host Lybid Roque Pinedo, a choral singing and rhythmics teacher from La Musique aux enfants, who will also be joined by four OSM musicians.
